Kennan Current: April Lead Story The Hundred-Year Legacy of the Russian Revolution and the World Today: How the Revolution Divided, Unified, and Shaped a Continent April 3-5, 2017 The Russian revolution played a critical role in defining the twentieth century in the processes it launched, the entities it created, and the reactions it inspired. This conference brought together leading thinkers in Central and East European Studies, Russian, and Jewish studies to understand how the challenges posed by the revolution defined the 20th century and continue to influence our world today. It was the first in a series of three events planned in 2017 in partnership with the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and the POLIN Museum of Jewish history.
